As Sponsors we chose Miss Mabel Damm and Mr. Jim Bradburn. We chose Mary Nell Gore, Margaret May, Bonita Litherland, and Sonja Badger as our Freshman Cheerleaders. Jerry Minto participated in the All School Play. At the end of the year some students received awards of special recognition. We chose Margaret May and Mary Nell Mattingly as football candidates, and Margaret May and Bonita Litherland as Basketball Candidates.

In our Sophomore year our enrollment was forty-two and our officers were: President, Don Rudolph; Vice President, Harriet Williamson; Secretary, Bonita Litherland; Treasurer, Clean McLain; and Historian, Mary Nell Gore. Margaret was elected Queen and Kathy was Maid of Honor. The candidates for basketball queen were: Bonita Litherland and Kathy Raley. Bonita was elected Queen and Kathy was Maid of Honor.
