

At Tell City Jr.-Sr. High School, students who plan to go on to college are offered a range of possibilities. Advanced Placement, or AP, simulates college classes. Out of the four AP classes, two of them are also dual credit. There are a total of 31 dual credit classes, which prepare students for the style and difficulty of college. Some, like psychology, are known to be dual credit; however, there are multiple classes that are less known to everyone that give the opportunity of college credit, including Principles of Engineering, Auto Tech, and Welding.





To earn a high school diploma, students must pass certain classes in order to meet the state's requirements. In four years, everyone must take classes that may or may not be fun. The state requires classes that include four years of English, a couple of years of science, and three years of math. Which diploma track a student wants to follow determines how much he or she can alter his or her required classes list. Taking composition and speech senior year instead of English 12 is an example of one of these alterations.

Graduating Class of 2013




























