Senior

Four years ago on the morning of September 16, 1949, 88 scared students entered Tell City High School to claim it as the mother of education for four years. At that time, we thought it would be the longest four years we ever spent, but now we feel that they were not long enough.

As are most freshmen, we were faced with the problems of selecting our schedule and finding our way around. The seniors tried to sell us physical education books. Like the classes before us, we survived that uncomfortable period when we were constantly being referred to as "green".



We were working very hard, and in May, the big event that really was important took place. The class planned a Junior-Senior Prom and Banquet. Then, came the Annual Magazine Sales Campaign. There was a great contest between the green and orange teams. The orange won, but without the green team, we never would have reached our quota of \$2,000. Total sales were \$2,148.




