If the whole of mankind seems bent toward moral and spiritual degeneration, then who among the confused will attempt to perpetuate in the conscience of the individual the true values of existence?




On December 2, between halves of the Tell City--Mt. Vernon game, we presented the coronation of T. C. H. S. 's second basketball queen. In early spring our class sponsored the annual Faculty vs. Seniors basketball game. We had accomplished very much this past year and looked forward to our next year, when we would be upperclassmen.

September rolled around again and we entered school with a greater feeling of responsibility.
